Event Descriptions

World Autism Awareness Day at the United Nations, Thursday, April 5th 8:00am-1:30pm

Community members are invited to celebrate Autism Awareness Month with Felicity House by joining us at the United Nations for a conference about "Empowering Women and Girls with Autism." Our Executive Director, Beth Finkelstein, will be presenting as part of a panel about gender disparity in the diagnosis process. Community members will meet at Felicity House at 8:00 am to take the bus to the

UN and will return at 1:30pm though participants are allowed to leave on their own. There will be no additional programming following the event and participants will not re-enter the townhouse. Space is limited for the bus so we won't have additional room for guests. Please note that this event will include long spans of quiet sitting. A Government-issued ID (Driver's License, State ID, etc.) is required to enter the UN.

Open Hours: Fridays, April 6, 13 & 20, 1pm-5pm & April 27, 3pm-5pm; Tuesday, April 10, 6-8pm Open Hours are opportunities to use the lounge, quiet lounge, art studio, and other public spaces in Felicity House to socialize or work on personal projects. A guest artist will be available during all open hours to help with any art projects you would like to work on. During Open Hours participants are asked to adhere to the different room usages described in the handbook.

On April 10th, check out our Writer's Room, a casual space where community members can go
to write poems, stories, plays, or anything else they want. A facilitator from Gotham's Writing
Workshop will also be there to provide writing prompts.

SIG: Book Lovers, Friday, April 6, 2-3pm

For this month's meeting, we'll discuss the classic coming-of-age novel, *The House on Mango Street*, by Sandra Cisneros. The story follows protagonist, Esperanza Cordero, a young Latina girl living in inner-city Chicago. Through a series of short stories, the book follows Esperanza's sometimes joyous, sometimes heartbreaking journey from childhood to adulthood. No need to read the book in advance.

SIG: Anime, Tuesday, April 10, 4pm-6pm

Participants will watch episodes 7, 8 and 9, of *Recovery of an MMO Junkie*. In this anime series, Moriko Morioka is a 30-year-old successful career woman who decides to quit her taxing corporate job and find a more fulfilling life. She joins an online MMORPG and creates a male character named Hayashi as her avatar. In the game Hayashi meets another character Lilly and the two become close friends. Meanwhile, in the real world, Moriko has a chance encounter with Yuta Sakurai, who may have ties with her online life. For future group meetings, participants are encouraged to recommend animes and participate in the anime survey.

Felicity House at the United Nations

On April 5th, The United Nations will celebrate World Autism Awareness Day by hosting a conference with a focus on women and girls with autism. This is in response to the UN General Assembly's 2017 resolution to draw attention to the challenges women and girls face regarding the implementation of the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD).



The panels will discuss issues that affect women with autism, including various forms of discrimination, and include speakers like Dakota Fanning and Julia Bascom. Felicity House's Executive Director, Beth Finkelstein, will participate in a panel on gender disparity in diagnosis. Other panels include topics like "Women with Autism in Film" and "Ableism, Sexism, Racism...How They Intersect." The goal of the event is to "focus on the importance of empowering women and girls with autism and involving them and their representative organizations in policy and decision making to address these challenges."

Community Members are invited to travel to the event with Felicity House, though space is limited on the bus. Since this is a public event, family members, service providers, or anyone else who would like to experience the conference, can RSVP through the UN here. Community members can leave the event any time they wish.
